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Management Commitment to Social, Health and Safety in Pulp Chain of Custody

- working conditions do not endanger safety or health
- forced labour is not used
- workers, who are under the minimum legal age, the age of 15, or the compulsory school attendance age, which ever is higher, are not used
- workers are not prevented from associating freely, choosing their representatives, and bargaining collectively with their employer
- workers are not denied equal employment opportunities and treatment

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Management Commitment to Responsible Forestry Values in Pulp Chain of Custody

We commit that we shall not be directly or indirectly involved in the following activities:

- Illegal logging or the trade in illegal wood or forest products;
- Violation of traditional and human rights in forestry operations;
- Destruction of high conservation values in forestry operations;
- Significant conversion of forests to plantations or non-forest use;
- Introduction of genetically modified organisms in forestry operations; and
- Violation of any of the International Labour Organization (ILO) Conventions, as defined in the ILO Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work, 1998.

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
